## *From the Principals*

As we move into Week 4, the classes have now settled into routines and are focusing on their classroom programs. Thank you to the students, teachers and the parents for their efforts in ensuring that we completed our initial in term swimming program successfully. We still have another program for the Pre Primary, Ed Support and some senior students at the end of term and I am sure that will go smoothly.

Our daily "morning fitness" program has begun and I was very impressed with our sports leaders who are guiding the other students through the session at the various activity stations. Physical activity is extremely important and assists the brain in learning, making these sessions important in preparing the students for their literacy and numeracy sessions to follow. Thank you to Mr Tomasevich for all his preparatory work and coordination of the program and the teachers for their supervision and work each morning.

Last Wednesday I was lucky enough to attend the presentations on our new Gifted and Talented cluster pilot program that we have introduced this year. The afternoon began with a professional learning session with our cluster teachers, followed by a presentation to parents. The presenter, Mrs Cavelle Monck, the Principal from Mt Lawley PS and an experienced educator of gifted and talented students, covered a number of topics from identification through to characteristics of students and programs and the outcomes expected from these clusters. The parent information session was really well attended and I thank parents for their interest and enthusiasm. Thanks also to Mrs Lewis for all her work in organising, coordinating and supporting the program. The annual school census was completed on Friday 15 February. This process is extremely important as it is a recording of the attendance of the students, and records the number of students enrolled at our school for 2019. Based on the data we provided, funding for our school is calculated and allocated, as part of the Student Centred Funding model upon which our funding is based. The amount of funding available will be communicated to us in the coming weeks.

With the hot and sunny days, we are currently experiencing, we all need to be "sun smart" so that we can be active outside but also minimise the impact of the ultra violet rays. As a result, we have a policy of "no hat, no play" meaning that if students do not have their hats, they cannot play outside. Our campus (via the P&C Uniform Shop) has Riverton Primary Campus hats available and they are both broad brimmed and safe. Our school hats are part of our school uniform and I encourage you to purchase these hats for your children. Once you have purchased the hat, please make sure that you accurately label them as they can get mixed up and/or lost. Thank you in advance for your support.

It is great to see our parents talking and interacting with each other at school at the end of each day. Our school community is very important and many friendships and acquaintances grow from the common experience of your children at the campus. Whilst this is good to see, parents should be aware that responsibility and duty of care for the children, be they school aged or younger, rests with the parents once they have collected their children from class. Please also be mindful of the fact that meetings and other activities such as teacher-parent meetings, preparation for the next day and marking of student work happen in classrooms after the official day has ended. Please be considerate of this when children are playing outside rooms. We are happy for children to use the toys and other facilities available outside rooms, but please have them return the equipment to the original position so that it can be found and used the next day by the students. ## Immunisation reminder

The West Australian Immunisation Schedule recommends that children who have turned 4 years of age have the following booster immunisations:

- DTPa-IPV (vaccine against diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis (whooping cough) and polio)
- All other WA schedule vaccinations recommended, completed including MMRx2 (measles, mumps, rubella)

Your child should have these immunisations as soon as they have turned 4.

- Central immunisation Clinic in Perth - 9321 1312
- Australian Immunisation Register - 1800 653 809 or [www.humanservices.gov.au](http://www.humanservices.gov.au)
- Your Community Health Nurse 9258 8053

At school enrolment, the parent/guardian is required to provide the immunisation status of their child. The only acceptable documentation for this purpose is the **child's Immunisation History Statement** from the Australian Immunisation Register (AIR). The date of the statement should be within the two months prior to enrolment.

A child's current AIR Immunisation History Statement can be accessed at any time by the parent/guardian through:

- MyGov, by logging in to their Medicare online account
- Medicare Express Plus App, by logging in to the Medicare account
- Visiting a Medicare or Centrelink office, or
- Calling the AIR General Enquiries Line on 1800 653 809 for the Statement to be posted.

Overseas immunisation records must not be accepted directly and must be verified by an Australian immunisation provider.
